



**Juvenile Justice Data Working Group
County Probation IT Survey
September 2015**

Background. In order to assess how upgrades to state data capacity would impact 58 different county-level data systems, the Working Group conducted a survey of county probation departments. The survey asked counties to describe their local juvenile justice data systems including costs, replacement plans and linkages with other agencies. The survey was conducted in September 2015 in cooperation with the Chief Probation Officers of California (CPOC). Forty-five probation departments submitted responses.
