> I am a County of Los Angeles resident and an employee of LA County. I believe you are the only board member who is seeing through the LA County Probation and BOS games. Recently, the soon to be resigning Chief has padded the numbers of field staff deployed to the juvenile halls. He has increased returning field staff to the halls and has not done enough to increase the number of Detention Service Officers, who are permanently assigned to Los Padrinos. In fact if you look at the statistics of New Hires who remain with Probation, I'm sure you would find the percentage to be low., due to safety issues and burnout from being held over 16 hours a shift. This Chief has abused the use of Field staff to the point there are hardly any field staff to monitor Adult and Juveniles released to the community and to assist them in their rehabilitation journey. I hope you and other Board Members do not allow LP to remain open due to a bandaid approach to temporarily increase the staffing numbers. It is too violent and the youth and staff do not feel safe. A mother of a detained youth replied to a comment I made on Instagram saying her son fears for his safety as LA County has been sending older officers to monitor them, who clearly do not have the physical capability to protect him from an assault. Indeed the youth on youth violence has increased and safety is a huge concern. If this Chief wanted to solve the problem he would permanently reassign field staff to LP to create stability at LP. I hope and pray the recent visit to LP did not miraculously make LP a suitable facility to house these youths.
