The bill would also require the board to make this data available on the board's Internet Web site on a quarterly basis. This bill further states: "Nothing in this chapter prohibits or restricts any government entity or official from sending to, or receiving from, federal immigration authorities, information regarding the citizenship or immigration status, lawful or unlawful, of an individual pursuant to Sections 1373 and 1644 of Title 8 of the United States Code."
