

Tribal Youth Diversion Notice of Intent to Apply

Federally Recognized Indian Tribes interested in applying for the Tribal Youth Diversion (TYD) grant are asked, but not required, to submit a **non-binding** Notice of Intent to apply. Failure to submit a Notice of Intent is not grounds for disqualification. Further, prospective Federally Recognized Indian Tribes that submit a Notice of Intent and decide later not to apply will not be penalized.

Listed below are the Federally Recognized Indian Tribes who have submitted a non-binding Notice of Intent to apply for TYD funds. This list will be updated on an on-going basis until March 25, 2019.
